

STATE UNIVERSITY OF MILAN

Also known as 'La Statale', the University of Milan is, relatively speaking, one of Italy's younger university institutions. It was founded in 1924 thanks to the tenacious efforts of doctor and gynaecologist Luigi Mangiagalli, who in creating La Statale, realised his long-held dream of building a university for Lombardy's regional capital.

Indeed, up until that point, it was the University of Pavia, founded in the fourteenth century and the main education centre in northern Italy, that housed the traditional university faculties. Over the centuries, however, the numerous educational institutions and schools of excellence which sprang up in Milan would later be incorporated under the University of Milan.

Why study at the State University of Milan?

1. The University is located in Milan, administrative headquarters to Italy's richest and most productive region, as well as Italy's financial and business capital. Milan is also one Europe's most renowned cities. As a city, has always embodied fashion, design, and finance, both in Italy and abroad.
2. Like all Italian State Universities, the University of Milan offers quality education at an extremely affordable cost.
3. With 10 study areas, 130 Bachelor's, Master's and single-cycle Master's degree programmes, and a wide postgraduate educational offer, the University of Milan can provide interdisciplinary courses to understand and deal with a shifting world.
4. The State University of Milan has a strong clinical and research expertise which will take Medicine students from the classroom to the laboratory through to the patient's bed in the main local hospitals.
5. The University has fully equipped libraries, databases and online archives to be consulted by students for their research and studies throughout the year.
6. The University of Milan offers a wide network to connect students as they go about their studies, embrace research, work on dissertation in one of the many foreign partner universities, in Europe and across the world.
7. The 2024 Almalaurea report shows that 78% of undergraduates and 79.6 of postgraduate or single-cycle students were employed within one year from graduation, against the national average respectively standing at 74.1% and 75% .
8. The only Italian member of the League of European Research Universities (LERU), the University of Milan ranks highly in key international rankings and has been awarded important funding such as the European Research Council's grants for its high-quality multidisciplinary research. Ranked 19th in Italy in the QS WUR by subject, 138th in the World's top universities, 200th in the world and 3rd in Italy in terms of reputation in the QS World University Ranking, and features in the 201-300 range in the Academic Ranking of World Universities.
9. The University of Milan supports its students with scholarships, benefits, services, study and work orientation events and interviews, databases, job fairs and a part-time option for working students.
10. The University of Milan is a member of the 4EU+ Alliance, a group of six European multidisciplinary, research-intensive academia of excellence. The goal is to create an integrated higher-education system together with Paris-Sorbonne, Charles University of Prague, Copenhagen, Heidelberg and Warsaw.
